
Pre-exposure Management for Healthcare Personnel with a **Documented Hepatitis B Vaccine** Series Who Have Not Had Postvaccination Serologic Testing

Healthcare personnel (HCP) with documentation of a complete series of HepB vaccine but no documentation of anti-HBs ≥10 mIU/mL who are at risk for occupational blood or body fluid exposure might undergo anti-HBs testing upon hire or matriculation. The algorithm below will assist in the management of these people. It was adapted from CDC.
