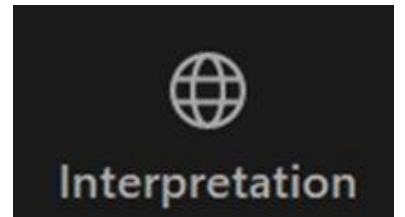



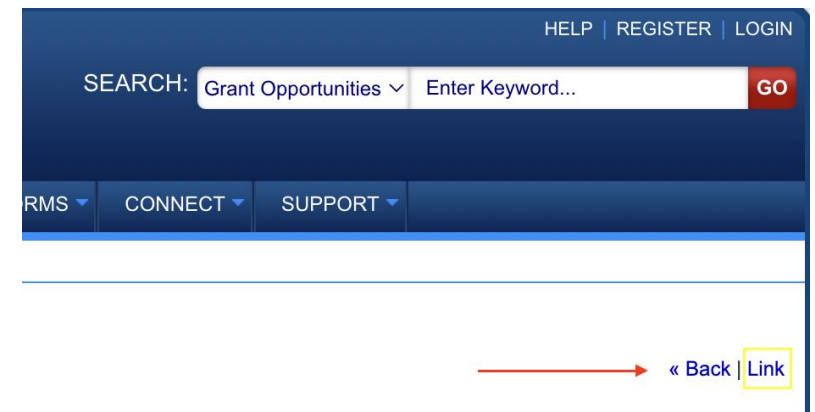
Sharing Links from Grants.gov

- The "**Export Detailed Data**" function on the search page returns a spreadsheet with individual links to funding opportunities.
- To share the link to an individual funding opportunity, click the "**Link**" button at the top right-hand corner of the page and copy the URL that appears.
 - Copying and pasting the link in your browser will return you to the Search page.

Key Steps of the Application Process

- 1. Develop an internal strategy for developing the application.**
- 2. Work towards the submission date.**
- 3. When writing, think like a reviewer.**
- 4. Complete required registrations. [Can take 3-14 business days.]**
- 5. Download the grant application package from [Grants.gov](https://www.cdc.gov/grants).**
- 6. Complete and submit the grant application package to [Grants.gov](https://www.cdc.gov/grants).**
- 7. [Track and submit](#) your application package.**

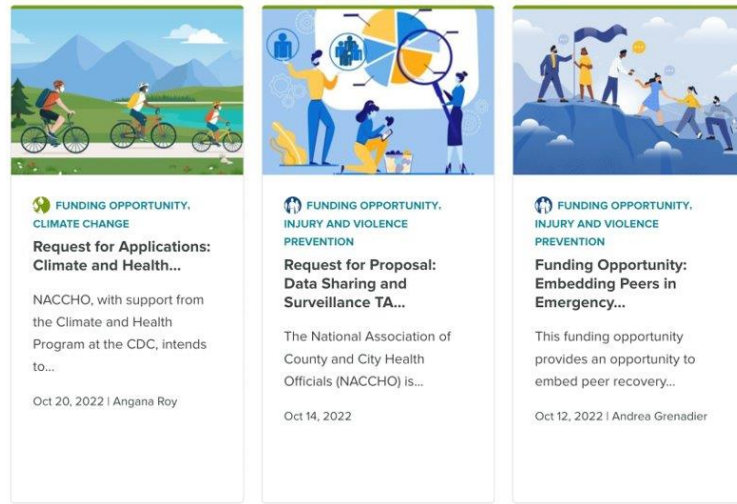

AmeriCorps

AmeriCorps' priorities for this funding opportunity are:

- Efforts to help local communities respond to and recover from the COVID-19 pandemic. Applicants may propose programming to aid communities in their efforts to recover from the COVID-19 pandemic, including public health challenges that have been exacerbated by the pandemic, such as mental health and substance abuse.
- Programs creating pathways to good-quality public health-related careers through onsite experience and training (including pre-apprenticeship or registered apprenticeship programs, work experience and job training programs, and other workforce training and development programs),
- Organizations leading service in communities with concentrated poverty, rural communities, tribal communities, and those organizations serving historically underrepresented and underserved individuals, including but not limited to communities of color, immigrants and refugees, people with disabilities, people who identify as part of the LGBTQIA+ community, people with arrest and/or conviction records, and religious minorities.

The application cycle for AmeriCorps (including for the 2023 Public Health Priorities) is open, with an application deadline of January 4.

Request for Applications from CDC: Developing a Public Health Tool to Predict the Virality of Vaccine Misinformation Narratives

The purpose of this Notice of Funding Opportunity is to support research to develop a predictive forecasting model that identifies new or reemerging misinformation narratives that are likely to disseminate widely and have a high potential for impact on vaccine confidence. The information from this model will then be used to develop a tool that public health agencies could use to predict misinformation trends in the populations served. Finally, the researchers will evaluate the tool's predictive capabilities on both future social media misinformation narratives and real-world events. [Learn more and apply by January 6, 2023.](#)

Community-Driven Approaches to Address Factors Contributing to Structural Racism in Public Health
