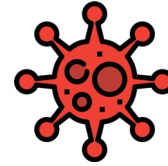

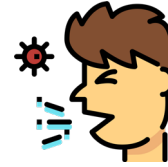




The most important facts

particles.

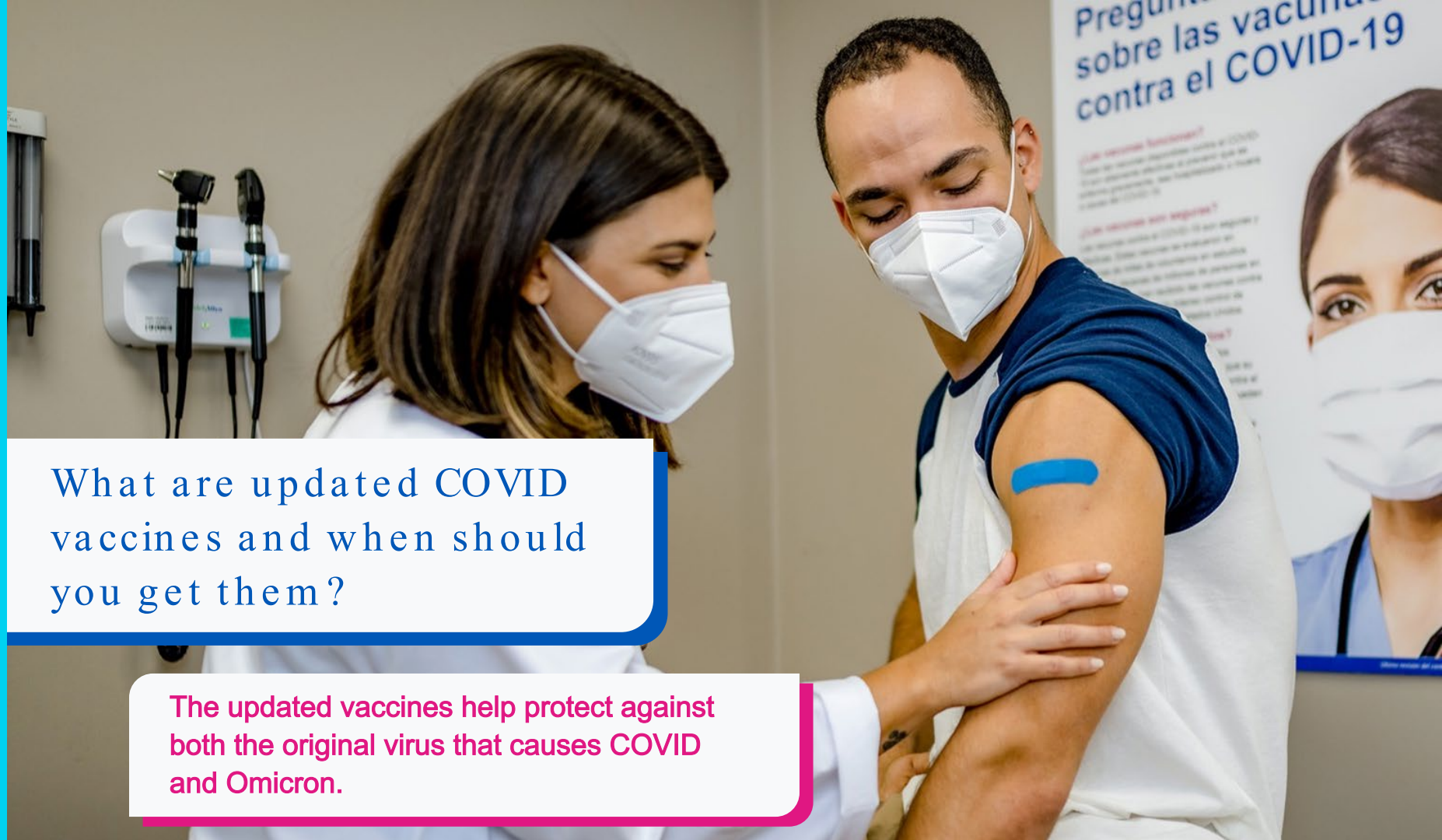


The closer you are to

Long COVID and its risks

Long COVID: experiencing new, returning, or ongoing health problems that can last more than 4 weeks —or even months —after infection.



What are updated COVID vaccines and when should you get them?

The updated vaccines help protect against both the original virus that causes COVID and Omicron.



Risks of not staying up to date with your COVID vaccine

Those who are up to date with their vaccine are less likely to be hospitalized or die from COVID.



The importance of updated COVID vaccines: Protection against a virus that is constantly changing

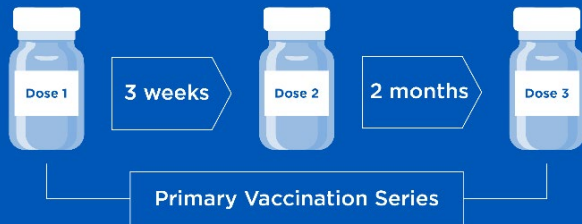

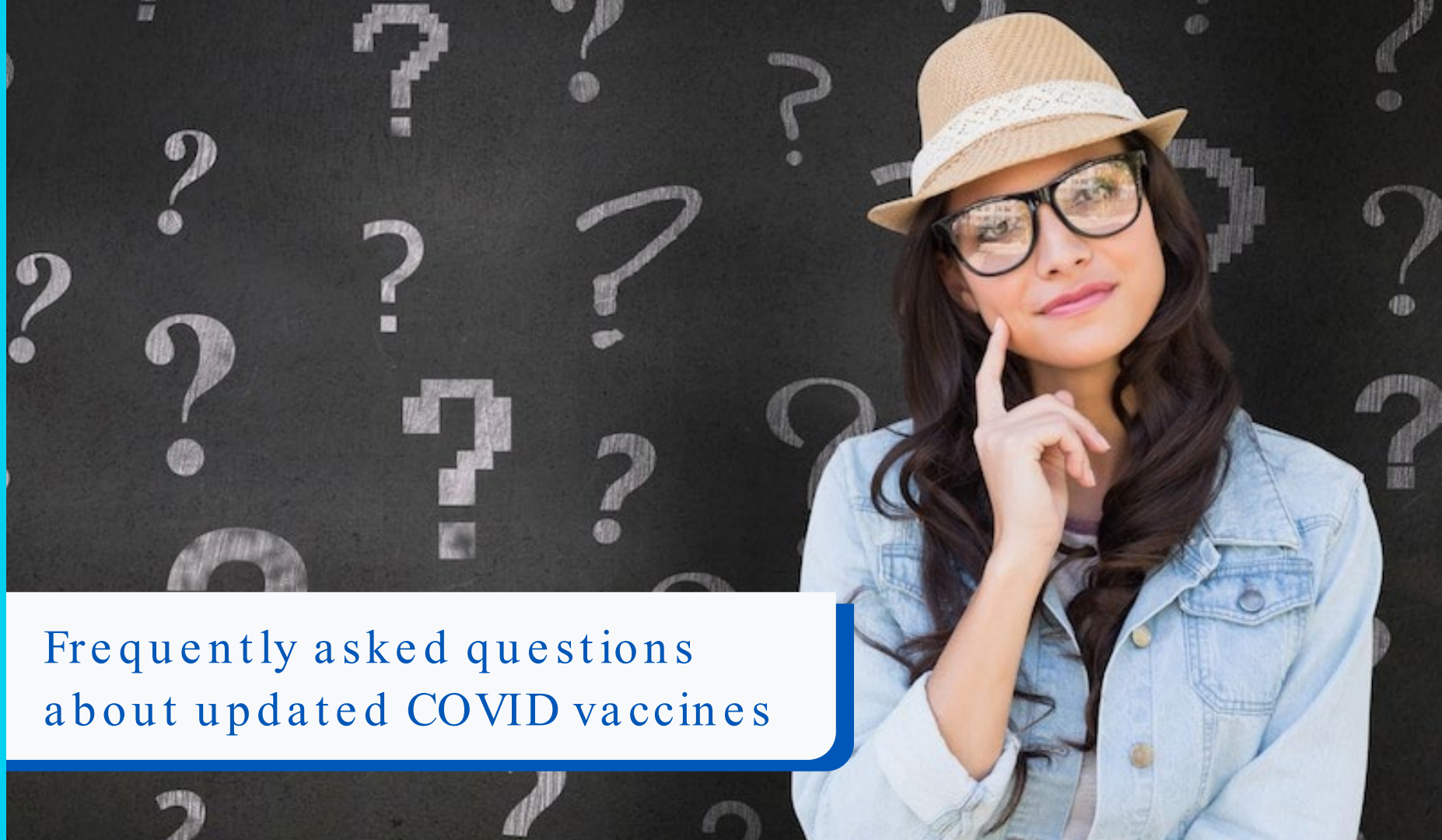
