WHAT IS HUMAN PAPILLOMAVIRUS (HPV)?

- HPV stands for **Human papillomavirus**
- HPV is the most common **sexually transmitted infection (STI)** in the United States
- Many different types of HPV exist and can sometimes cause health problems (ex: genital warts & cancers)

How does **Human Papillomavirus (HPV)** spread?

- By having sexual relations with someone who has the virus
- HPV is spread through intimate skin-to-skin contact
- Someone can pass on HPV infection even if they have no signs or symptoms

WHEN SHOULD SOMEONE GET THE **HPV VACCINE**?



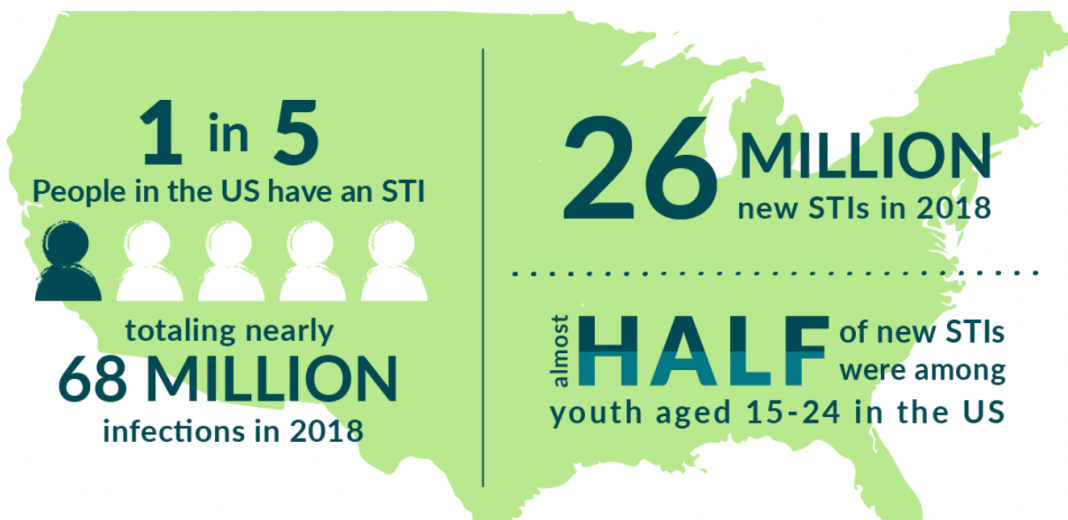
HPV Vaccination is recommended for all persons through the age of 26!

HOW MANY DOSES OF THE **HPV VACCINE** ARE NEEDED?


2 or 3 doses are recommended depending on age at initial vaccination or medical condition

SAFETY IN **PREGNANCY**

HPV Vaccine is **NOT** recommended until after pregnancy

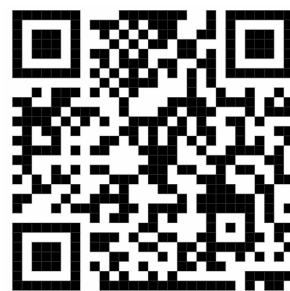
WHAT ARE SOME POSSIBLE SIDE EFFECTS OF THE **HPV VACCINE**?

- PAIN, REDNESS, OR SWELLING IN ARM WHERE SHOT WAS GIVEN
- DIZZINESS OR FAINTLY
- NAUSEA
- HEADACHE

HPV VACCINE IN ADULTS OVER 26

Upon clinical discussion with their healthcare provider, some adults ages 27-45 years may receive either a 2 or 3 dose series of the **HPV Vaccination**
