Influenza/flu

Influenza (flu) is a contagious respiratory illness that infects the nose, throat, and sometimes the lungs.

People at increased risk:

- Adults 65 years and older
- Children younger than 5 years old
 - Children younger than 2 years old are at highest risk
- Pregnant people
- People with asthma
- People with chronic lung disease
- & more

Flu Vaccine

Prevent flu by getting the flu vaccine every year.

- The flu vaccine has shown to reduce flu-related illnesses and risk of serious flu complications.

It is recommended that everyone 6 months and older should get a flu vaccine every flu season.

- Those aged 6 months to 8 years who are getting the flu shot for the first time will receive it in two doses.
 - Separated by at least 4 weeks.



Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV)

Respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) is a virus that affects the lungs. RSV season begins in the fall and peaks in the winter.

RSV is the leading cause of infant hospitalizations in the U.S.

RSV can be dangerous for infants and some young children.

Children at greatest risk for severe illness from RSV are:

- Infants and young children (the younger the age, the greater the risk)
- American Indian and Alaska Native children
 - American Indian and Alaska Native children are **4-10x** more likely to experience severe cases.

 <p>Adults 60 and over</p>	RSV vaccine	<p>Adults ages 60-74 who are at increased risk of severe RSV AND Everyone ages 75 and older</p>	Available any time, but best time to get vaccinated is late summer and early fall
 <p>Babies</p>	RSV antibody (nirsevimab) given to baby	All infants whose mother did not receive RSV vaccine during pregnancy, and some children ages 8-19 months who are at increased risk for severe RSV	October through March*
 <p>Babies</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">OR</p> <p>RSV vaccine (Pfizer's ABRYSVO) given to mother during pregnancy</p>	All pregnant people during weeks 32-36 of their pregnancy	September through January

² Solid organ recipients ages 18 through 64 years on immunosuppressives may get high-dose or adjuvanted flu vaccine, if available, but not preferred.

³ All infants should be protected by either maternal RSV vaccine or nirsevimab. Both are not needed for most infants. For infants born during October through March, nirsevimab should be administered in the first week of life—ideally during the birth hospitalization.

Ask your provider how to protect your infant from RSV this season.

The RSV immunization protects babies, pregnant people, and elders.



American Indian and Alaska Native children face higher risks of severe illness from RSV, but there are 2 ways to protect them. The maternal RSV vaccine Abrysvo is given during 32 – 36 weeks of pregnancy, Sept-Jan. Maternal antibodies protect the baby against RSV ~6 months after birth. Or, infants < 8 months (and all AI/AN infants up to 19 mo. in the 2nd season) receive a single dose of Nirsevimab (Beyfortus) in an RSV season, usually Oct 1-Mar 31. #NativeHealth #NativeAmericanHeritageMonth
