Introducing the Vaccine Resource Hub

- Why it was created
 - O To increase access to trusted, vetted, community-specific resources and education about COVID-19 and influenza vaccines for minority and BIPOC communities and the organizations that serve them.
- Intended uses for the Learning Community

Members of the Learning Community will be able to contribute resources that they have created and deployed among their communities and clients to share the most valuable resources in delivering vaccine-related education.


Browsing & downloading resources

Integrating with the Learning Community Hub

Next steps and what to expect

Expect an email that will invite you to reset your password for the vaccineequity.urban.org website. Doing this once will allow you to use the same credential to access both sites going forward.

A: Keep an eye out for your resource after you submit it. Someone from the Vaccine Resource Hub will be in touch via email if there are any issues.
